 United Nations Command (UNC) represents a coalition of nations formed on July 7, 1950 which are **committed** to the Republic of Korea's defense. Its establishment was authorized by United Nations Security Council Resolutions (UNSCRs) 82-85.

 Enforce the 1953 Armistice Agreement, coordinate UNC Member State contributions, and execute assigned functions directed by the U.S. National Authorities through the Joint Chiefs of Staff to restore peace and security on the Korean Peninsula.

- Strengthen efforts to restore peace and security on the Korean Peninsula.
- Build multilateral relationships with Allies and Partners.
- Maintain communication with the DPRK.
- Support the functions of the Military Armistice Commission and Neutral Nations Supervisory Commission.
- · Maintain access to basing options in times of conflict.
- **Support** the ROK in the coordination of UNC Member State contributions during Armistice, Crisis and Conflict.
